Call to Order / Pledge of Allegiance / Roll Call

A regular meeting of the Whiteford Agricultural School Board of Education was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Board President Shane Hillard on February 12, 2024. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Hillard. Present were Shane Hillard, Mike lott, Dave Dixon, Janelle Young, Jeff Bunge, and Jason Vida. Kristi Mock was absent.

Also present were Superintendent Scott L. Huard, Director of Finance & Business Services Marisa Tebbe-Cousino, Director of Human Resources Cathy Machcinski, MS/HS Principal Jeremy Fielder, Assistant Principal/Athletic Director Jeremy Simmons, and Director of Transportation & Buildings and Grounds Charlie Butz. There were 14 visitors present.

Approval of Agenda

A motion was made by Jeff Bunge, seconded by Dave Dixon, to amend the February 12, 2024, Regular Meeting Agenda to include new item f. Adopt Resolution – 2023-2024 Budget Amendments and new item g. Meal Charge Policy and approve as amended. Motion approved – 6 yes (1-absent/Mock).

Public Comment

A representative from The Growing Tree Preschool spoke regarding the possible Young 5 Program at Whiteford. They support this program but if it was put in place this upcoming school year, it would affect their enrollment.

Two Whiteford students attended the meeting and expressed their support of the proposed golf program at Whiteford. They stated it would be a great way to stay active and promote comradery.

<u>Student Participation</u> – Miss Aubrie Simmons attended the meeting and updated the board on the latest student activities as follows:

during halftime at the men's basketball game against rival Summerfield on February 2nd.
Their formal dance was held the next day on Saturday.

Leski Wittman Insurance Agency Staff Member of the Month – Superintendent Huard recognized Jay Yockey, HS Social Studies Teacher, as January Staff Member of the Month. Mr. Yockey was nominated by Marsha Groll. Chris MacMillan of the Leski Wittman Insurance Agency attended the meeting and presented Jay with a \$100 gift card. Superintendent Huard warmly congratulated Mr. Yockey, read from Mrs. Groll's nomination form and shared that Jay is a dedicated teacher, coach, advisor, mentor, and colleague. Director of Finance & Business Services - Mrs. Tebbe-Cousino:

- W2 preparation is complete and were sent out by January 31. Still working on the 1095's (health care) and they will be mailed by the end of February to meet the deadline.
- Annual café onsite review was completed by the February 1st deadline
- Applying for a grant that will reimburse the district for student negative balances at the end
 of last year that were written off. This requires a School Meal Charge Policy approval by the
 board.
- Went over the 2023-2024 budget adjustment/amendments

Director of Human Resources - Mrs. Cathy Machcinski:

- 2nd Administrative Assistant Workshop will be held Friday February 16th
- CRDC report is complete. Mrs. Machcinski took a moment and publicly thanked the office administrative assistants for all their hard work in their part of this collection (student records).
- Completed the change in insurance carriers at record speed. We can now add new staff electronically, which saves time and paperwork.
- Working with the technology department to learn/implement processes and procedures
- Updated some sections of the Finance Manual ready to roll these out this week

Recommendation to Hire Assistant Softball Coach

A motion was made by Jason Vida, seconded by Mike lott, to hire Lynn Hammerstrom as Assistant Softball Coach through EduStaff at the rate of \$1,600 per the terms of the 2023-2025 WEA Mater Agreement and contingent upon favorable previous employer conduct and FBI/State of Michigan background checks. Recommendation to Hire Assistant Baseball Coach

A motion was made by Janelle Young, seconded by Dave Dixon to hire Nick Guthrie as the Assistant Baseball Coach through EduStaff at the rate of \$1,600 per the terms of the 2023-2025 WEA Master Agreement and contingent upon favorable previous employer conduct and FBI/State of Michigan background checks. Jeff Bunge inquired if a decision needed to be made soon regarding a Young 5's program at Whiteford due to the impact it would have on the current enrollment for The Growing Tree Preschool for their upcoming school year.
