Transitional Kindergarten (TK) Information

What is Transitional Kindergarten (TK)?

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is designed for children who may not yet be ready for the demands of a traditional kindergarten classroom. This can be due to various factors such as age, developmental progress, social skills, or academic readiness. In TK, the teacher provides students with a strong foundation in early literacy and math skills, while also helping them develop essential social skills.

Students in TK learn to collaborate with their peers, build stamina for challenging activities, and foster a love for learning. TK bridges the gap between a child's current learning experiences and success in kindergarten. It does this by teaching kindergarten content at a pace and style that matches each child's developmental level. After completing the TK program, students will transition into a regular kindergarten classroom, resulting in two years of kindergarten experience.

Eligibility and Placement

TK placement is based on criteria such as age, maturity, social skills, and prior school experience. The program is free for qualifying students, with transportation provided for district residents. TK follows the elementary school's full-day schedule and calendar.

Screening occurs during Kindergarten Round-Up in March. The program is designed for students turning five between May 1 and December 1, but children turning five before May 1 may also be considered. TK is limited to 15-18 students. Placement priority is first given to district residents and children of employees. If openings remain, siblings of School of Choice students and new School of Choice applicants are considered.

How is a Transitional Kindergarten classroom different from a regular kindergarten classroom?
