#### What is section 98c?

Section 98c funds are available to local education agencies through Public Act (PA) 144 of 2022 (MCL 388.1698c) which was signed into law on July 14, 2022 by Governor Gretchen Whitmer. Section 98c appropriates federal funding to address learning loss as part of the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund and part of the federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II Fund.

## To be Eligible for Section 98c

- → Apply by November 30, 2022
- → Provide how funding received will address learning loss (Lost Instructional Time)
- → Post this plan on the Whiteford Agricultural Schools website
- → Describe how the impact will be measured
- → Detailed report to the State by July 14, 2023 regarding how funds were spent

# What funds will Whiteford receive?

- → Just over 52 million dollars in federal funds are part of Section 98c, but is is unclear how many districts are applying until the application window is closed to determine local district fundingFunding will be distributed equally to each district applying based on per pupil membership
- → MDE calculates the amount and it is anticipated districts will receive funds in early winter
- → An initial estimated amount is \$36.75-\$50 per student (\$29,000-\$40,000)
