It is time to register your Kindergartner for the 2025-2026 school year! Your child must be 5 years old by September 1, 2025, to be eligible for kindergarten.

Please sign up for an appointment to attend Kindergarten Round-Up to enroll your

incoming kindergartner for the upcoming school year (click first link below)! We are offering three appointments per each 15-minute time frame to allow our elementary enrollment coordinators the opportunity to review all of the necessary paperwork.

Please bring all of the aforementioned paperwork to be reviewed as your child is going through the screening process with our staff. Hearing and vision tests will also be conducted for registration at this time.
