It is time to register your Kindergartner for the 2025-2026 school year! Your child must be 5 years old by September 1, 2025, to be eligible for kindergarten.

Please sign up for an appointment to attend Kindergarten Round-Up to enroll your incoming kindergartner for the upcoming school year (click first link below)! We are offering three appointments per each 15-minute time frame to allow our elementary enrollment coordinators the opportunity to review all of the necessary paperwork.

Please bring all of the aforementioned paperwork to be reviewed as your child is going through the screening process with our staff. Hearing and vision tests will also be conducted for registration at this time.

The Michigan Green Schools Program supports and celebrates the achievements of PreK-schools in protecting the state's air, land, water, and ecosystems through their commitment to environmental education and stewardship actions.

How It Works

To receive Green School certification, a school must document completion of at least 10 approved environmental activities. Schools can achieve one of three status levels, depending on the number of activities documented:

A school is eligible to receive a Green School, Emerald School, or Evergreen School Environmental Stewardship Designation depending on the number of activities completed by the school and/or students. At least two activities must be completed from each of the four categories to be eligible for any designation.

The activity requirements for each level of environmental stewardship designation are as follows:

- Green School: 10 total activities with at least two activities from each of the four categories.
- Emerald School: 15 total activities with at least two activities from each of the four categories.

Evergreen School: 20 total activities with at least two activities from each of the four

The four categories of activities for official Green School qualification are:

1. Reduce/Reuse/Recycle
2. Energy
3. Environmental Protection
4. Miscellaneous
